



Weekly bulletin – 13 July 2019

Leaders Doncaster Town have now opened up a 32-point gap at the top of the table after a seven-wicket win over Barnsley, who started the day in third place. Opening bowlers Curtis Free and Aamir Jamal had the visitors in early trouble at 41-4, with Aamir taking the prized wicket of Harpreet Singh. Beck Frostick and Steve Nuttall then laid the platform for a respectable total with 85 for the fifth wicket, but after James Stuart had got the home side off to a brisk start, Bilal Anjam and James Ward put on 126 for the third wicket to ensure a Doncaster victory.

Sheffield Collegiate's 264-9 was the day's highest score on their visit to Wickersley, which proved just enough despite half-centuries from Dave Rodgers and Garry Park for the home side. Shaaiq Choudhry enjoyed another fine all-round game for the visitors with 69 runs and four wickets, and his team move back into second place.

Probably the result of the day was at Field Lane, where Elsecar inflicted on Wakefield Thornes their third home defeat of the season – more than in their three previous seasons altogether. David Toft skippered, opened the batting and kept wicket for the home side, and his 62 was their only significant innings. Seasoned campaigner Ian Swallow then led the visitors to a comfortable win with a fine unbeaten 63. Tickhill also enjoyed a fine away win, by five wickets at Treeton, where a 97-run fifth wicket partnership between Mark Cummins and skipper Jordan Lowe saw the visitors to victory with over five overs to spare.

Jack Wood shone with bat and ball for Whitley Hall in their comfortable win over Aston Hall, who are now on level points with Wickersley but are above them in the table by virtue of their five-wicket win at Northfield Road in May. Bottom club Hallam recorded their first League win since the opening day of the season, and their first at Cricmar Lane, thanks to a 153-run opening partnership between Andre Bradford and Alex Hughes. In a game marred by a serious knee injury to their young all-rounder Jordan Cook, Cleethorpes slipped to 48-4 chasing 226 to win, and finished 50 short despite a fine 65 from Tom Rollinson, who added 71 for the fifth wicket with Alex Osmond.

Next Saturday

Leaders Doncaster Town, unbeaten in seven games, are at home to second-placed Sheffield Collegiate, and will be seeking to consolidate their position by completing a double. Wakefield Thornes will hope to bounce back from their defeat against Elsecar by doing the double over Whitley Hall, one of the few sides to have won at Field Lane in the League.

Barnsley entertain Aston Hall, having won at Green Lane in May, but the visitors have improved since then with three wins in the last six games. Cleethorpes and Wickersley meet at Chichester Road with both sides needing the points to pull away from the relegation zone; Cleethorpes won at Northfield Lane early in the season but have now not won since 27 May.

Treeton will seek to bounce back from yesterday's defeat against Tickhill by completing a double over Elsecar; and Hallam travel to Tickhill, who have won three of their last four games, with some confidence after yesterday's win over Cleethorpes.
